We do not accept American Sign Language or "dead" languages such as Latin or Greek.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Complete a minimum of 120 credits. Of those 120 credits, at least 40 must be in upper-division courses (courses numbered 300 or higher).</li> <li>Receive a grade of "C-" or higher in each core course.</li> <li>Attain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher and meet any other grade requirements stipulated for your major.</li> <li>Attain a grade of "C-" or higher in all upper-division courses required by your major.</li> <li>Complete all major requirements specified by the department offering the degree.</li> <li>ENGL 101 and 102 meet the university English Composition Requirement.</li> <li>MATH 123 meets the university Math Requirement.</li> </ul>
